Dear Mr. Dykmann:

In accordance with the *2001 State Protocol Agreement Between The Utah State Director Of The Bureau Of Land Management And The Utah State Historic Preservation Officer VII. B*, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Monticello Field Office (MFO) requests a review of the cultural resource field procedures proposed to identify cultural properties and evaluate effects on cultural properties for the San Juan ATV Safari OHV Event. The BLM MFO has been designated the lead agency for this event involving public lands on the BLM MFO and the BLM Moab Field Office, as well as the Manti-La Sal National Forest and Utah State Institutional Trust Lands Administration (USITLA) lands. While on BLM and USITLA administered lands, off road vehicle use will be limited to existing roads and trails. While on National Forest administered lands, vehicle use will be limited to routes in the Manti-La Sal National Forest Travel Plan. Approximately 500 miles of roads and trails have been identified for use during this event.

In accordance with 36 CFR 800.4 (b), the BLM MFO and Moab Field Office will do a Class I inventory of all proposed roads and trails. A complete inventory for this event is not feasible. Monticello and Moab Field Offices BLM will do a reconnaissance survey (U-03BL-0317b), on routes that have not been previously altered by County road maintenance activity (BLM H-8120. 9.I). Where applicable, the survey will include USITLA lands. A post-event monitor survey will be conducted to evaluate secondary impacts to cultural site locations. With respect to Manti La-Sal Forest roads and trails, the proposed action will not have impacts on cultural sites if the ATV traffic is limited to existing routes in the Forest Travel Plan. Each individual office will do Native American consultation for this event.

When the Environmental Assessment is completed for this event, final consultation will be submitted to you for review along with a recommendation for effect on cultural properties.


